News from the Headteacher

The highlight of our week at school was being able to confirm that we will now re-open next Monday to ALL year groups and Breakfast Club and After School Club will also be open.

You will have seen messages over the last two days regarding staggered starts and ends of day pick-ups. We have to follow these requirements to ensure social distancing for each year group. As mentioned, please arrive promptly at these times, with a face mask on, and leave as soon as you can. There are some rules being relaxed – four people meeting from two households etc. – but the advice remains very much to stay home and stay safe. Dropping off and picking up your children can be done very safely if we all follow the agreed drop off points at the right times and wearing safety coverings over our faces.

PC Gareth visited Bl. 1 & 2 again this week, and I have asked that he spends the whole morning with us next week in Junior classes. He will be able to cover many issues with these year groups and provide any support and help that may come out from the conversations with children.

You'll see calendar events already coming up now for Bl. 5 and cycle proficiency training, Dosbarth Derbyn learning to use the no pedal balance bikes and multisport activities for Bl. 2 & 3. We are returning to normality!

Gemma tells me there is an exciting new menu coming out for after Easter, which is great news. We encourage all children to take advantage of our hot nutritious and healthy range of dinners. If your child is eligible for a free school meal, we really do hope you take advantage of this entitlement. The bank credit system will cease now, so you will no longer be charged for the dinner and the traditional system of eligibility will return.

Junior Classes: Remote learning

The first day or so will be a catch up and check in for all Junior aged children. They can spend some time reuniting with class mates and their teachers, and having a chat about anything on their minds. Help us if you are aware of any anxieties and we can support your children accordingly.

You will see more boxes have arrived. Yet more Chromebooks! Another 36. We are investing in your children's futures, and if anything positive has come out of home schooling, it is that your children are so much more IT literate than any generation before them. We anticipate using more paper free resources in the future as your children have grasped ways of working electronically, that are far more appropriate – in certain cases – than recoding in a book with a pen or pencil.

As a school, and on behalf of all our staff, I cannot tell you how excited we are for Monday's return. The school has been a lonely place for too long. Foundation Phase helped bring half the school building back to life and with Key Stage 2's return, we anticipate a happy return to normality that we have all hoped for, for so long. With the safety measures we have employed throughout, we will do our very best to ensure your children are safe with us. We must be diligent; the pandemic is far from over. Help us to help you to help your children stay safe. Our collective team effort is crucial.


